About Us

The UCI Train New Trainers (TNT) Primary Care - Child and Adolescent Psychiatry (PC-CAP) Fellowship is a year-long clinical education certificate program for primary care-oriented trainees and providers who wish to receive advanced training in the care of pediatric and adolescent patients with behavioral health concerns. This training is provided by national experts, many of whom are “triple-boarded” in pediatrics, psychiatry and child / adolescent psychiatry. The program includes a strong focus on learning with translation to excellent delivery of behavioral healthcare for all youth and families, including underserved populations. PC-CAP started in 2022, with a goal to expand access and to facilitate better care and outcomes for youth and the primary care providers who work with them. Mostly importantly, trainees will learn how to teach these principles to their primary care colleagues.

Multi-faceted Curriculum:

The fellowship, developed and taught by UCI faculty and other national experts, comprises more than 45 required hours of training and results in a certificate of completion from UCI School of Medicine. Specific fellowship components include:

- Two weekend in-person teaching sessions (approximately 25 CME hours)
- Live, case-based discussions with a focus on integrated primary care psychiatry twice a month (at least 20 CME hours)
- One hour per month of small group mentoring sessions with a TNT PC-CAP faculty mentor
- Complimentary lifelong learning for alumni

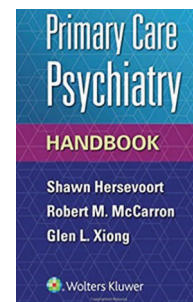
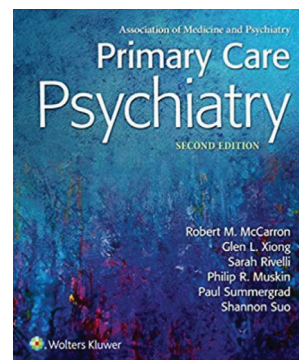
